

Benton Farmer Killed by Auto

Clifford Henry, 51, Benton county farmer and magistrate, died yesterday afternoon at General hospital of injuries received when he was struck by a car at Tenth and Woodland sts.

Mr. Henry died less than three hours after suffering compound fractures of the right leg, head injuries, a probable shoulder fracture and other injuries.

His death brought to 21 the traffic fatalities in the Nashville-Davidson county area this year. Eleven deaths have been recorded in the county, 10 in the city.

Driver of the automobile was listed by police as Payton Donald Donoho, 24, a city fireman of 923 Carolyn ave. Mr. Henry was crossing Woodland at an angle at the time of the accident, Donoho told Traffic Officers M. L. Mullican and J. F. Herron.

There was no arrest.

Mr. Henry was a lifelong resident of Benton county. He had farmed in the 13th civil district.

Survivors include his parents, Mr. and Mrs. M. F. Henry of Camden; two daughters, Mrs. Gruen Hensley and Miss Ann Henry of Benton county; two sisters, Miss Martha Henry and Mrs. Pauline Merrick of Oak Ridge, Tenn.; and a brother, Claude Henry of Ripley, Tenn.
