Will of DAVID R. GREEN, deceased
 I, David R. Green of the county of Carroll and state of Tennessee, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all further wills by me made, and first I direct that my body be decently buried in a manner suitable to my condition in life, and as to such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to intrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows. First, I direct that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my Executors from any portion of my estate, real or personal. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Green, my home tract of land where I now live, the tract of land that I bought of A. Lipe, to have and to hold during her natural life or widowhood, and at her death to be sold and divided between the following heirs of my body, viz, Elizabeth J. French, J. C. Green's heirs, Mary A. Rogers, Martha Bomer, Nancy C. Smith, Luisa S. Taylor, James D. R. Green, Thomas L. Green, Mariah P. Butler and David A. Groom, my grandson. If he lives with me or his grandmother until he is twenty-one years of age, and if he does not, nothing. And I give unto my wife Elizabeth Green as much of my stock as shall be deemed necessary for her benefit and comfort, and all my household and kitchen furniture, to have and to hold; also one buggy and one wagon, all my farming tools that should be necessary. Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto J. D. R. Green and T. L. Green, my sons, one hundred and seventy-five acres of land, more or less, bounded as follows, on the north by the land of William Green and William Martin; on the east by the land of Widow Groom; on the south by the land of J. C. Green's heirs; on the west by the lands of J. H. Green, to be equally divided between J. D. R. Green and T. L. Green, according to quality and quantity at this time so as for J. D. R. Green to have the houses where he may live. I do hereby make, ordain and appoint my sons, J. D. R. Green and T. L. Green, executors of this my last will and testament on one sheet of paper, set my hand and seal the twenty-eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

 her benefit and comfort and all my
 household and kitchen furniture to have
 and to hold also one Buggy and one Wagon
 all my farming tools that should be necessary
 for her use.


Thirdly - I give and bequeath unto
 J. D. Green and J. L. Green my sons one
 hundred and seventy five acres of land more
 or less bounded as follows on the north
 by the land of J. M. Green and Wm. Martin
 on the East by the land of widow Grooms
 on the South by the land of J. C. Green heirs
 on the West by the lands of J. C. Green to be
