He served in the militia prior to the fall of Charleston. A.A.5567; P332.

Norris, Thomas

He served in the militia after the fall of Charleston. A.A.5568; P329.

Norris, William

Beginning in February 1779, he drove a wagon for one hundred ninety-nine days under Col. Joseph Kershaw and Lt. Col. Eli Kershaw. In addition, he served forty days in the militia during 1779 under Col. John Marshall and Col. Joseph Kershaw. A.A.5569; T298; V222.

Norris, William, Jr.

He served sixty-eight days in the militia during 1782. A.A.5569; V223.

North, Charles

He served in the Horseshoe Company of the Colleton County Regiment of militia under a Capt. Postell during 1775. He served two hundred twenty-seven days in the militia in 1781. A.A.5571; S288; (Osborne, Thomas, W9217).

North, Edward

He enlisted during August 1775 in the Charleston Volunteer Militia under Captain Charles Drayton. Later, he appears as a captain and was carried to St. Augustine as a prisoner. S.C.H.&G., I, 134, 187; XXXIII, 4.

North, John

He was in the Charleston Militia Regiment under Captain James Bentham during 1778. S.C.H.&G., LIII, 15.

North, John

He first served as a ranger under Pollard and was stationed on Flint River. After moving to Georgia, he served as a ranger under Capt. Alexander Irvin and Gen. Twiggs. (Moved to Ohio and Ind.)

North, John

From June 1781, he served two hundred thirty-six days in the Horseshoe Company of the Colleton County Regiment of Militia. He served forty-seven days as a lieutenant in the company from February 1782. He served one hundred seventy-two days from December 1782 under Capt. Youngblood. A.A.5573; S287.

North, Richard

He enlisted in the Fourth Regiment on 8 No-

vember 1777. N.A.853.

North, Thomas

He enlisted in the Fourth Regiment on 8 November 1777 as a matross and re-enlisted on 1 January 1780. N.A.853.

Northcutt, William

He served seventy days in the militia during 1782. A.A.5573A; N598.

Northent, William

He served in Marion's brigade during 1782. Gregg, p. 411.

Norton, Hugh

He served eighty-eight days in the militia during 1782. A.A.5574; P441.

Norton, Jacob

He served in the militia under Gen. Marion. A.A.5574½.

He served with South Carolina troops. McCall, III, 177.

Norwood, Daniel

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 31 May 1777 as a sergeant. In 1779, he was under Capt. Felix Warley. After being taken prisoner on 29 December 1778, he died aboard a prison ship on 13 August 1779. S.C.H.&G., V, 144; N.A.853.

Norwood, John

He was in the St. David's Parish Volunteer Company under Capt. Elias DuBose. S.C.H.&G., III, 133.

Norwood, John

Before the fall of Charleston, he served as a private in the militia. He became a captain in a ranger unit after the death of Capt. Andrew Miller in the battle at Cowpens and was wounded in a skirmish at Pratt's Mill against William Cunningham and the Indians. (Miller, John, S1702); A.A.5578; V55; W621.

Norwood, Richard

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 17 Feb-

ruary 1779 under Capt. Joseph Warley and was missing in action at Savannah on 9 October 1779. S.C.H.&G., V, 149; N.A.246; N.A.853.

Norwood, Samuel

He served thirty-five days in the militia. A.A. 5579; N596.

He enlisted in the Rangers on 10 July 1775 under Capt. John Purvis and re-enlisted on 24 July 1776. In addition, he served in the militia before and after the fall of Charleston. P.I.; S.C.H.&G., I, 301; A.A.5579; Q326; N.A.853.

Norwood, Theophilus

- b. 1755, Va.
- He enlisted in the Rangers on 19 June 1775 under Capt. John Purvis and re-enlisted on 24 July 1776 and 31 May 1777. In 1779, he was under Capt. George Lidell. He served in the militia before and after the fall of Charleston and lost a horse while in service. S.C.H.&G., I, 301; II, 185; V, 155; A.A.5580; Q327; N.A.853.

Norwood, Theophilus

- He enlisted in the First Regiment on 4 November 1775 and re-enlisted in December 1776. P.I.; N.A.853.

Norwood, Thomas S21400

- b. 17 June 1761, Augusta County, Va.
- While residing on the Saluda River, he entered service during 1781 under Capt. Samuel Rosamond. He marched to Cuffeytown and was enrolled by Maj. Field Pardue to serve in Capt. Richard Johnson's company of horse. He was in the siege of Grayson's Fort and the siege of Ninety Six as a baggage wagon guard. He served under Capt. Rosamond after the siege was lifted. Thereafter, he joined Capt. Robert Maxwell, with whom he served until the end of the war. A.A.5581; Q324.

Nosier, Jean Baptiste

He enlisted in the First Regiment on 20 August 1778 and was a drummer on 18 September 1778. N.A.853.

Nossman, Jacob

He served in the Colleton County Regiment of Militia under Captain John Wilson during 1775. (Osborne, Thomas, W9217).

Notcher, William

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 17 March 1779 under Capt. Joseph Warley and re-enlisted on 1 February 1780. S.C.H.&G., V, 149; N.A.246; N.A.853.

Nott, Samuel

He served in the Second Regiment under Capt. Francis Marion and was in the hospital on 10 December 1775. S.C.H.&G., III, 201.

Notts, Nathaniel

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 13 February 1779 under Capt. Uriah Goodwin. S.C.H.&G., V, 150; N.A.853.

Nourse, William

- While a resident of Berkley County, Virginia, he became a crewman on the Confederacy under Capt. Seth (Scott) Harding on 16 October 1780 in Philadelphia. They sailed to the West Indies where they captured a British brig and an African slave ship. Sometime in March or April 1781, the ship was captured and the crew became prisoners on the British ship Roebuck. He was transferred to the prison ship Jersey and carried to Portsmouth, England, and imprisoned until 1782. Upon his return, he became a sailor on the frigate South Carolina. During December, he was captured by the British and was paroled at Long Island, N. Y. (Moved to Ky.) A.A.5581A; Y237.

Nowland, Auberry

Nowland, Thomas

He enlisted in the Second Regiment on 18 February 1779. N.A.853.

Nowling, John

He enlisted in the Fourth Regiment on 1 November 1779 as a corporal under Capt. William Mitchell and re-enlisted on 1 January 1780. N.A.246; N.A.853; N.A.859.

Nubi, James

He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment on 30 March 1776. N.A.853.

Nuckells, Richard

He enlisted in the Sixth Regiment on 26 March 1776. N.A.853.

Nucom, Robert

He served in the militia alternately after the fall of Charleston. A.A.5497; S163.
