STATE OF TENNESSEE, DICKSON COUNTY, ss.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we *Jonathan Petty, Gabriel Petty*
William Frazer all of Dickson county in the state aforesaid

are held and firmly bound unto his excellency the Governor of the said state, for the time being, in the sum,
of *five hundred* dollars, to be paid to the said governor, his successors or
assigns: To which payment, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves and each of us, each and every of
our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals,
and dated the *7th* day of *April* A. D. 182*7*

THE CONDITION of the above obligation is such, that the above bounden *Jonathan Petty*
administrator of all and singular the goods and
chattels, rights and credits of *Samuel Petty* deceased, do make or cause
to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of the de-
ceased, which have or shall come into the hands, knowledge or possession of the said *J. Petty*

or into the hands or possession of any person or persons
for *him* and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited to
the court of the county aforesaid, within ninety days from the date of these presents; and the same goods, chattels
and credits, and all the other goods, chattels and credits of the deceased, at the time of his death, which at any
time hereafter shall come into the hands or possession of the said *Jonathan Petty*
or into the hands or possession of any person or persons for

Said Jonathan Petty do well and truly administer according
to law; and further, do make or cause to be made a true and just account of *his*

said administration within two years after the date of these presents; and all the rest and residue of the said
goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said administration account, the same
being first examined and allowed by the court of said county, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons,
respectively to which the same shall be due, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of the act in that case
made and provided; and if it shall appear that any will or testament was made by the said deceased, and the
executor or executors therein named, do exhibit the same into court making request to have the same allowed
and approved of accordingly; if the said *Jonathan Petty*
above bounden, being thereto required, to render the said letters of administration (approbation of such testament
being first had and made in the said court) then this obligation to be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in
full force and virtue.
