Deed from **ROBERT NELSON** to **SAMUEL FRENCH**
Territory South of Ohio, Tennessee County, June 8th 1796

Indenture made this 20th day of April 1796, between Robert Nelson of the Western Territory and County of Tennessee, and Samuel French of the county and territory aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid, for a tract of land in Tennessee County, on the north side of Red River, beginning at a black oak on Adam Philip's line.

Deed to **JOHN RICE**, assignee of **JOHN STOVEALL**
State of North Carolina, Tennessee County, June 8th 1796
To John Stoveall, a private in the Continental line, we give to John Rice, assignee of John Stoveall, a tract of land containing six hundred and forty acres in Tennessee County, on the north side of Cumberland River, joining the northwest corner of Barrard Tatum's preemption, Military Warrant No. 1136, and the grant dated the 16th day of November 1790.

Deed from **ISAAC HOLLIS** to **WILLIAM HOOPER**
Territory of the U. States, Tennessee County, July 4th 1796
Indenture made this 27th day of April 1796, between Isaac Hollis of Tennessee County and William Hooper of Davidson County, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred pounds current money to me in hand paid, for a tract of land in Tennessee County, on the waters of McAdoo Creek, the head of the north fork.

Deed from **BENJAMIN McINTOSH** to **RICHARD DODGE**
Territory of the U. States, Tennessee County, July 4th 1796
Indenture made this 21st day of April 1796, between Benjamin McIntosh of Tennessee County and Richard Dodge of the county aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty pounds to him in hand paid, for a tract of land in Tennessee County, in the Barrens between Red River and the Sulpher fork of Red River, and containing fifty acres.
