and as touching such worldly Estate as has to be left
me with in this Life I give Dismiss and Dispose of
the same in the following Manner and form—
I Do constitute and ordain John Middleton and
Samuel Porter Lawful Executors— First
I Will and bequeath unto Elener my beloved
Wife all my moveable affects. Also I will and
Bequeath all My Lands and Tenements unto my three
beloved sons viz Samuel Norwood and John Middleton
Norwood Richard Norwood and Debts owing to me
And all Debts that I am in are to be paid out of the
Above named three boys share of the Estate— and I do
hereby Disavow all and every former will and testament
Protesting and Confirming this and No other to be my will
and Testament in witness whereof I set My hand and seal

 ing and memory do constitute this my last Will and Testament and desier it may be believed
 by all as such First I most humbly beggeth my soul to God my maker beseeching his most
 gracious acceptance of it and I give my body to the earth from whence it was taken in
 full assurance of its resurrection from thence as for my burial I desier it may be decent
 without pomp or state as to my worldly estate I will and positively order that all my debts
 be paid first I give to my dear and loving wife during her widowhood the use of the plan-
 tation that I now live on and too houses to worke it with all the utensils thereto belonging to
 with the hoes and house furniture likewise the cattle to be kept for the use of the same
 during her widowhood and nothing to be put to sail but at her death or marriage the
 Land and cattle to be sold and equally divided between the three youngest boys John
 Samuel and William also I give unto my son John the bay Sallon Colt likewise give
 unto my son Samuel the bay filley and to my son William I give the barrel Colt and I
 give unto my daughter Mary the young bay meer and I give unto my daughter Sarah the bay
 meer only the ere to make up unto there sister Elsie beath a beart as good as any that
 hir sisters got or the value thereof in some other thing— And I do constitute my
 deare and loving wife Exeutor of this my last Will and Testament likewise I do con-
 stitute Robert Anderson Esqr and Alexr. Aston as Trustees over my wife and children
 in witness whereof set my hand and seal the twenty fourth Day of August in the
 year 1788—
