PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of The United States for the District of Rhode Island

The petition of Joseph Desbure hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 113 Constitution St. Bristol RHODE ISLAND.
(Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Second. My occupation is Wagon

Third. I was born on the 11 day of Aug., anno Domini 1864, at Wolfeboro, Canada

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Wolfeboro, Canada, on or about the 19 day of Aug. anno Domini 1885, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Newport, R.I., on the 20 day of Aug. anno Domini 1885, on the vessel C. P. R.
(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 13 day of November, anno Domini 1904 at Providence R.I. in the U. S. District Court of Rhode Island

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to GEORGE V, KING OF GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 20 day of Aug., anno Domini 1885, and in the State of RHODE ISLAND, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 21 day of November, anno Domini 1897, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the Court of Providence R.I. on the 13 day of November, anno Domini 1904, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce and Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
