April 1836 having been detained 296 days for bad conduct. [Ledger 45, p. 125]

Moses A. Nelson was received in the Penitentiary 25 Jan. 1834. He is 5' 9 1/2" in height and weighs 163 lbs. Light hair, blue eyes, fair complexion, 34 years of age. Born and brought up in Washington Co., Tenn., where his mother still resides, about three miles south of Brownsborough. He has seven brothers and one sister. His brothers reside in Missouri. His sister, who is a widow named (Hickson), in Indiana. He cannot tell what county in either state. He has an uncle John Hughes living in Sequence [sic,] Valley and a wife and nine children now residing in Hamilton County but expects to remove to [blank]. His wife was the daughter of Adam Gann, dec'd, of Jefferson Co. Tenn. He has a scar on the inside ancle and one on the instep of the left foot, a scar on the inside angle of the right foot, a scar just below the knee of the right leg, and a small mole on the left breast. He has generally followed farming. Was found guilty of petit larceny at the Circuit Court of Cocke County and sentenced to one years confinement in the Jail and Penitentiary House of the State of Tennessee. Moses A. Nelson was discharged by expiration of sentence on the 24th day of January 1835. [Ledger 45, pp. 125-6]

Henry Norwood. From Carroll County. Crime: buggery. Sentence: five years from 12 May 1841. Rec'd 12 May 1841. He is 16 years old, 6' ½' high, weighs 148 lbs. Was born in Madison Co., Tenn., and brought up in Carroll Co. on Blunt Creek, 12 ½ miles from Huntingdon and one mile from Sandy, where his father Wm. Norvell now lives. He has three sisters and two brothers married, one brother in Texas, one in Arkansas at Little Rock, also one sister married to a man by the name of John Nandin and lives on Birdsong Creek, Benton Co., Tenn. Has dark hair, hazle eyes, fair skin and somewhat freckled. [Ledger 45, p. 126]

Obadiah Norris. From Claiborne County. Sentence: three years from Feb. 5, 1842. Crime: manslaughter. Rec'd Feb. 5, 1842. He is 25 years old, 5' 8" high, weighs 174 lbs. Born and brought up in Gra[i]nger Co., Tenn., on Bull run, 2 miles from John Chesney's mill. Has a wife and one child living at Boon Creek Forge in Claiborn[e] County. He has sandy hair, black eyes, fair skin. Has worked three years at Boon Creek Forge in the employ of J. Frazier. [Ledger 45, p. 126]

Jesse Norris. From Dickson County. Crime: larceny. Sentence: three years from Feb. 24, 1842. Rec'd Feb. 26, 1842. He is 46 years old, 5' 6 ½" high and weighs 128 lbs. Born in Georgia and brought up in Dixon Co., Tenn., on Yellow Creek. He has a wife and four children living on the road leading from

born in North Carolina, occupation: labourer. court in Fayette County, and sentenced to 1 year eb. 8, 1841 and discharged Feb. 8, 1842. Notes: er 86: 495.

0, born in Alabama, occupation: labourer, a court in Fayette County, and sentenced to 5 ived Feb. 8, 1841 and discharged Feb. 9, 1846. Number in ledger 86: 496.

17, born in Tennessee, occupation: labourer. a court in Fayette County, and sentenced to 5 ved Feb. 8, 1841 and discharged Apr. 20, 1844. Imber in ledger 86: 497.

born in South Carolina, occupation: labourer. in Wilson County, and sentenced to 10 years in 8, 1841 and discharged June 29, 1850. Notes: Number in ledger 86: 498.

22, born in Tennessee, occupation: labourer.

Convicted of horse stealing by a court in Lauderdale County, and sentenced to 4 years in the Penitentiary. Received Feb. 11, 1841 and discharged Aug. 15, 1844. Notes: died of chronic diarrhae [sic]. Number in ledger 86: 499.

Name: John Bordine, age 27, born in Virginia, occupation: boatsman. Convicted of larceny by a court in Tipton County, and sentenced to 3 years in the Penitentiary. Received Mar. 8, 1841 and discharged Jan. 7, 1844. Notes: pardoned by Gov. Jones. Number in ledger 86: 500.

Name: Cleveland Estep, age 19, born in North Carolina, occupation: labourer. Convicted of larceny by a court in Carter County, and sentenced to 2 years in the Penitentiary. Received Mar. 20, 1841 and discharged Feb. 13, 1843. Notes: conduct good, pardoned by Gov. Jones. Number in ledger 86: 501.

Name: John Venable, age 16, born in Tennessee, occupation: labourer. Convicted of larceny by a court in Williamson County, and sentenced to 3 years in the Penitentiary. Received Mar. 23, 1841 and discharged Feb. 22, 1844. Notes: conduct good, pardoned by Gov. Jones. Number in ledger 86: 502.

Name: Alexander McClennan, age 28, born in North Carolina, occupation: labourer. Convicted of burglary [sic] & larceny by a court in Hamilton County, and sentenced to 5 years in the Penitentiary. Received Apr. 4, 1841 and discharged Jan. 31, 1843. Notes: died of chronic dysentary. Number in ledger 86: 503.

Name: Stephen Snell, age 41, born in North Carolina, occupation: an ex sh[eri]ff. Convicted of forgery by a court in Henderson County, and sentenced to 3 years in the Penitentiary. Received Apr. 23, 1841 and discharged Feb. 22, 1844. Notes: pardoned by Gov. Jones, conduct good. Number in ledger 86: 504.

Name: Henry Norwood, age 16, born in Tennessee, occupation: none. Convicted of buggery by a court in Carroll County, and sentenced to 5 years in the Penitentiary. Received May 12, 1841 and discharged Jan. 31, 1846. Notes: pardoned under the act of 1836. Number in ledger 86: 505.

Name: William Roach, age 24, born in Tennessee, occupation: labourer. Convicted of larceny by a court in Hardiman [sic] County, and sentenced to 3 years in the Penitentiary. Received May 23, 1841 and discharged Mar. 31, 1843. Notes: conduct good, pardoned. Number in ledger 86: 506.
