I William Hatley Sen^r of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina, being in a low state of health, but sound, in mind, and memory, as usual. Thanks be to God for it, do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner, and form as follows -

1st That all my just debts, be paid

2^d I give unto Latha Hatley, Widow of John Hatley dec^d. Ten barrels of Corn, and Caw and Calf and Shucks sufficient to winter them, and to live unmolested, in the house where she now lives, as long as she thinks proper, with the privilege of fire-wood, and as much open ground, as she, and her children, can tend -

3^d I give and bequeath unto Lincey Hatley, daughter of John Hatley, and Negro girl by the name of Burling to her and her heirs for ever -

4th I give and bequeath unto Mary C. Hatley, and Negro girl by the name of Cleader, to her, and her heirs for ever.

5th I give and bequeath unto Sharward Hatley four Negroes, namely, Abram, Nancy, Sary, and Analiza also Ten barrels, Corn, and Caw & Calf and Shucks sufficient, to winter them, to him and his heirs for ever - Also I give hundred pounds of Pork -

6th I give and bequeath to my brother Abner Hatley forty barrels of Corn -

7th I give and bequeath unto Abner Hatley, son of

8 I give and bequeath unto Tilpha Hatley, daughter
of Abner Hatley, and Negro boy by the name of Solomon
9 I give and bequeath unto Cynthia Hatley, ^{daughter} of the above
named Abner Hatley, and Negro boy, by the name of
Jim to her and her heirs for ever
10 I give and bequeath unto William Hatley, son of
Abner Hatley, all the Land that I now possess, ~~and~~
with the Exception of the Land whereon Briton
Hatley lives, also and Gray Horse by the name of Joe
to him and his heirs, for ever -
11 It is my wish and desire, that my Old Negro manlings
may choose any of my Relation, to live with, that he
may think proper, and he shall be there, without any
Valuation, and when he becomes past labouring for
his support, then receiving my Estate, in proportion ther
of, throw in to his support - so long as he shall live
also it is my desire that the balance of my Negroes
that I have not heretofore named, should not be
sold, but, be valued, and equally divided amongst
the children of my Brothers, and Sisters, and those receiving
said, pay to them that receive less, so as all to be made
equal, with all the residue of my Estate that I
have not heretofore given away.
12 And lastly, I do hereby constitute, appoint, and
ordain, my trusty Nephews, Briton Hatley and
Prudden Hatley, my Executors or Executors, or either
